
JANUARY IN AUSTRALIA


This month I was very lucky to come and stay with a family in Brisbane. The family had four daughters that I got along with very well. I had an amazing time and made so many good memories.









We went on a trip to Noosa and had a swim at one of the beaches there. Absolutely loved Noosa.













My host sister and I got a cartoon picture drawn of us at a market in Caloundra.








